School Profile 2017-2018

Founded in 1962, the Anglican International School Jerusalem is a nursery to grade 12 school. The school is coeducational and serves children from 47 nationalities. AISJ is committed to the development of the whole child and is founded on Christian beliefs and values whilst respecting the rich and diverse communities within the school and in its unique location. We strive to create a warm and caring environment, in which students, families, and staff feel respected and valued.

PROGRAM

AISJ offers a rigorous and varied academic program and first class pastoral care. The elementary curriculum in Nursery to Primary Years 6 is broadly based on the International Primary Curriculum. In the secondary school, we offer the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program (MYP) for MY 1-5 (grades 6-10) and the Diploma Program (DP) for DY 1-2 (grades 11 and 12). The courses offered in MY4-5 and DY1-2 also lead to an American high school diploma. Enrollment in our school is non-selective. Our curriculum is adapted to the needs of an international student body and responsive to the rich learning opportunities for study in the region.

ACCREDITATION

AISJ is fully accredited by Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and was the first school in Israel to be accredited by the International Baccalaureate Organization. In 2016, the school became an accredited member of the Council of British International Schools.

FACULTY

The secondary school faculty consists of 19 full-time staff and 15 part-time staff who hold 21 postgraduate certificates and 1 doctoral degree. Seven of the faculty are IB examiners in their subject areas.

STUDENTS

Total Enrolment is 319 students, ranging from age 2 to 19. They represent 47 nationalities; approximately 25% are local students, 42% from Europe, 20% from North America, 6% from Africa, 6% from Asia, and 1% from South America. Secondary school enrollment is 151 students: 109 in MY1-5; 29 in DY1 and 13 in DY2.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of 20 credits: 4 in English, 4 in Social Sciences, 3 in Mathematics, 3 in Science, 2 in one Foreign Language. All secondary students must complete a course in Religious Education each year. Students in Diploma Years are required to complete CAS requirements (Creativity, Activity and Service).

Grading System

7 – Excellent, 6 – Very good, 5- Good, 4- Satisfactory, 3- Mediocre, 2 – Poor (fail), 1 – Very poor (fail).

Transcripts and GPA

AISJ provides transcripts for students' grades achieved in all classes in MY4-5 and DY 1-2 (grades 9-12) while at our school. The GPA is weighted according to the table provided on the transcript. In the first semester of DY1, IB candidates are all placed in HL courses, and receive HL weighting in the GPA calculation. At the end of the first semester of DY1, students declare their HL and SL choices, after which their grades are weighted accordingly.

Class Rank

AISJ does not provide class ranking for seniors. There is no appropriate ranking system that would adequately account for our highly transitory, international students, many of whom transfer from schools with different educational and grading systems.
